## Prerequisites for the Italian Studies Major

• Italian 1103.01, 1103.02 or 5051

## Requirements for the Italian Studies Major with a History of Art concentration (33 credits)

- (3 credits) Italian 2102
- (6 credits) two 3000-level courses taught in Italian
- (3 credits) one 4000-level or above course taught in Italian Credits for content courses (not language courses) taught in Italy that have been preapproved by an OSU advisor may replace these content courses in Italian from the French and Italian Department.
- (9 credits) 3 courses taught in English in the Department of French and Italian of which only one course can be at the 2000-level, one at the 3000-level or above and one at the 4000-level or above.
  - Credits for content courses (not language courses) from any OSU approved study abroad program in Italy that have been pre-approved by the advisor may replace content courses from the French and Italian Department. (See table A below).

## Requirements for the History of Art major

- (12 credits) 4 courses from the Department of History of Art selected from Table B or students may petition for a course that is not on this list.
- (12 credits) 4 Core courses:

HA4001: Writing in History of Art 2

HA4005: An Introduction to Artistic Media and Techniques (or a 2000-level foundational studio course in the Art Department) 3

HA4010: An Introduction to the Methods and Theories of Art 4

HA4016: Senior Seminar in History of Art (prereq: senior standing or permission of the instructor)

- (12 credits) 4 History of Art courses: Two courses from Area II: Modern Art of Europe and the United States (after 1700) and two courses from Area III: Global Art (Arts of Asia, Africa, and Central & South America). At least two courses must be from the 4000-level or above.
- Elective: (3 credits) One additional History of Art course at the 5000-level or above

Students wishing to graduate with research distinction may substitute 3 credits of 4999 or 4999H: *Undergraduate thesis* for one course offered in English from the Department of French and Italian or one similar course from the History of Art Department.
